To: All Pastors

My brother priest:

In the 25th chapter of the Gospel of St. Matthew, Our Lord states very clearly that an essential element of the mission of the Church is to provide the basic necessities of life to our brothers and sisters in their time of need. Clothing the naked, feeding the hungry, visiting the sick and imprisoned and welcoming the alien is required to be a faithful follower of Jesus.

Each parish of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston does much to address the needs of the people who live within their area. However, there are many people whose needs cannot be met by the parish alone. For this reason the Archdiocese supports archdiocesan-wide social service agencies like Catholic Charities, San Jose Clinic and St. Vincent de Paul Society, to name a few. Like most charities, these organizations provide a tremendous service, but find raising sufficient amounts of funds a great challenge.



I would like to invite you to attend the **42nd Annual NFPC Conference for Priests.** Our gathering will be **April 12-15**, **2010** at the **Hilton Post Oak Hotel** in the Galleria district of **Houston**, **Texas**. The theme this year is "**The Call to Holiness and Wholeness**" and is **open to all priests**. This is the first time the NFPC has had its conference in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston and if you haven't been able to attend in the past, this is an ideal time.

The conference will be an excellent opportunity to hear outstanding speakers such as **Most Rev. John Quinn** Archbishop Emeritus of San Francisco, **Rev. James Martin**, **S.J.** culture editor of *America* magazine, and author of the bestselling book *My Life with the Saints*, **Rev. Lou Cameli**, the writer and general editor of the *Basic Plan for the Ongoing Formation of Priests* and **Rev. John Cecero**, **S.J.**, a clinical psychologist, and associate professor in the Department of Psychology at Fordham University.

On Tuesday, April 13, Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, Archbishop of Galveston-Houston, will preside at a liturgy at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and there will also be representatives from the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops' Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations and presbyterates from other countries.

In addition, there will be opportunities to tour local attractions, gather resources and to network with other priests from around the country to discuss current issues facing the church and priesthood.


