HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

Reminder: On a back to back occurrence of Sunday and Holy Day there is a precept of Eucharist participation for each day. However, whenever January 1 (Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God), or August 15 (Solemnity of the Assumption), or November 1 (Solemnity of All Saints) falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated, however, at least one Mass for the Solemnity is still to be celebrated.

This does not apply to December 8, (Feast of the Immaculate Conception) or December 25 (Christmas).

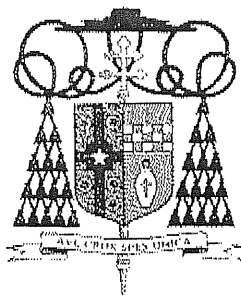
COMMUNICATIONS WORKSHOP

I am very grateful for the consideration you will give to this traditional appeal. Please forward your donation to the Chancery as soon as possible after Christmas.

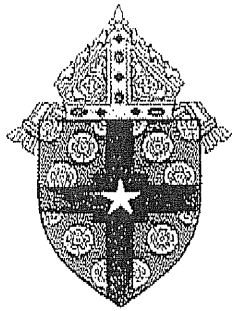

Dear Father:

This letter serves as a reminder regarding the implementation and reporting deadline (December 31, 2011) for the new Sacred and Safe Program, the safe environment educational effort for children in Kindergarten through the 12th grade. This is the first year of an annual implementation for this program.

On March 1, Cardinal DiNardo sent a letter to all pastors explaining the rationale for the program and requesting that every parish participate. Subsequently, on March 25, I sent pastors a letter detailing how the implementation and reporting process would occur.

It is imperative that we, the Archdiocesan church, remain vigilant in our efforts to protect our children from sexual abuse. The Sacred and Safe program provides our children and their parents with the faith-based means to do this. We are also accountable to the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People by documenting our Archdiocesan efforts.

Your continued support is needed to insure that your parish has completed the Sacred and Safe Program for all children in grades K-12 and reported the attendance to the Safe Environment Office no later than December 31, 2011.

The Offices of Continuing Christian Education and Youth Ministry have completed extensive trainings throughout the Archdiocese for parish catechetical leaders in how to implement the program. The offices remain available to assist parish catechetical leaders with the implementation process. Please direct any implementation questions to sacredandsafe@archgh.org or call 713-741-8792. The Safe Environment Office is responsible for handling the parish reporting of the children/youth attendance for this program. For reporting program attendance, please direct questions to Julie Blevins, the Safe Environment Office Manager, at jblevins@archgh.org or 713-652-4401.

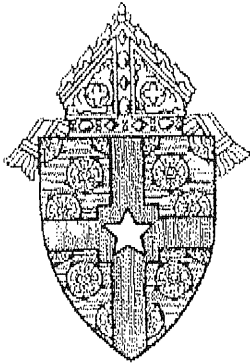

PRESBYTERAL COUNCIL

Minutes
Meeting of October 4, 2011

The Council met in the Board Room of the Nold Education Building at St. Mary's Seminary. Cardinal Daniel DiNardo presided. Fr. Sean Horrigan called the meeting to order at 10 a.m. Father Albert Zanatta offered the Opening Prayer. Fr. Sean Horrigan took the roll.

MINUTES: The minutes of August 16, 2011 were accepted as presented. Fr. Lahart moved the acceptance of the minutes and Msgr. Rossi seconded it. They were accepted by a voice vote.

PRESBYTERAL COUNCIL/PERSONNEL BOARD ELECTIONS: Elections will be held for the following positions on the Presbyteral Council and Personnel Board:

Presbyteral Council: Central & Northeast Deaneries (Fr. Albert Zanatta, CRS has served two terms and is not eligible for re-election), Southwest & Northwest Deaneries (Fr. Sean Horrigan has served two terms and is not eligible for re-election), and Education (Fr. Dan Lahart, SJ is eligible for re-election).

Personnel Board: 16-25 years of ordination (Msgr. Frank Rossi is no longer in this category), and Associate representative (Fr. Thu N. Nguyen has served two terms and is no longer eligible for re-election).

Frs. Cahill, Horrigan and Zanatta will serve as the election committee.

Fr. Bruce Noble, the Chaplain representative, has been granted retirement. As per the bylaws of the Council, Fr. Page Polk, OFM, the runner-up in the last election, automatically assumes his position on the Council effective immediately.

ARCHDIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN UPDATE: Mr. Jim Barrette, Secretariat Director of Pastoral and Educational Ministries, and Mary Grace Landrum of the Planning Oversight Group, updated the Council on the archdiocesan pastoral planning. Phases 1 and 2 are now complete and a newly released "midway point" report gives a snapshot of the current reality of where we are at as an archdiocese. The Cardinal has approved this midway point report and it has been mailed to all priests. Phase 3 of the Pastoral Plan is now underway and will be completed by the end of year, at which time Phase 4 will commence. The goal is to offer recommendations to the Cardinal's office by March 2012 and implementation of the recommendation from the plan will follow.

The Listening Sessions held throughout the archdiocese for the Pastoral Plan attracted more than 1,400 participants, including 441 who attended special sessions geared toward their demographic (priests, deacons, women religious, Spanish, youth, etc.). More than 4,000 returned surveys in the pews, workshops and on-line. More than 300 Pastoral Council members from 33 parishes participated. In all, there were approximately 7,000 participants from 128 of the 141 parishes in the archdiocese. An independent analyst of the methods and participation of the study has concluded that the data gathered is "statistically significant" and mirrors the geography and demographics of the archdiocese in a manner well suited to determining future planning.

There was considerable conversation from the Council on the influx of Hispanic Catholics to the archdiocese. By 2020 it is projected that nearly 75 percent of Catholics in the archdiocese will be Hispanic. It was noted that while the majority will be Spanish-speaking there still will be a great need for programming and ministry in English. Nearly half (46 percent) of 18-25 year olds are Hispanic. Currently, only about 15 percent of Catholic youth receive all of their Sacraments of Initiation, and nine out of 10 remain unchurched.

Population growth for the counties covered in the archdiocese project more than a million more people in the next 10 years. All counties are expected to grow, but especially Harris County.

The number of active priests' projects to remain stable in the next 10 years, but there is expected to be a more than 30 percent increase of the ratio of Catholics per priests in the years between 2010-2020.

The survey affirmed five key areas for the future: Meaningful prayer, liturgy, sacraments; supporting spiritual growth; providing formation and education; providing social services and outreach; and fostering a strong sense of welcome and hospitality.

The Cardinal emphasized that now is the time for the archdiocese to explore and discern how to translate the numbers and data into meaningful information for the parishes. The Council urged Mr. Barrette to provide bulletin information via the Chancery Advisory or other means so that a sense of excitement and enthusiasm can build for the future planning of the archdiocese. Without a tangible plan for how the collected data will be used it will remain just "numbers on a page," but if the parishes can help communicate the information to the faithful a sense of enthusiasm can begin to build.

The Cardinal said the emphasis of the planning must have impact for the pastors and parishes if it is to be successful. The discernment phase will make that a priority.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS: Among the items discussed for possible future agenda items were (in no particular order): How to best introduce new priests to the archdiocese, hospital coverage, retired priests compensation, future plans for St. Mary's Seminary, the starting time for priests' funerals to greatest opportunity for others to attend, stories in Texas Catholic Herald concerning smaller parishes, faculties for visiting priests, and a review and update of the Pastoral Plan.

It was noted that all priests are invited to submit items for consideration for the agenda at any time through their Council representative.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/CONSULTATIONS: Cardinal DiNardo gave a brief overview of developments impacting Catholic Charities. Both internal and external reviews are continuing at this time.

The Cardinal said the confirmation schedule for the upcoming year is in the process of being finalized. Archbishop Fiorenza and Bishop Rizzotto will continue to offer assistance in presiding at confirmations in their retirement, but their schedules will be reduced this year at their own request. Retired bishops Edmond Carmody (Corpus Christi) and Raymundo Pena (Brownsville) have offered to assist in the archdiocese. Msgr. Sheltz and Msgr. Rossi will continue to offer assistance at confirmation masses as well. There has been no new development from Rome in the area of possible auxiliary bishops at this time.

The Cardinal solicited feedback from the Council on the ongoing preparations in parishes for the implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal. It was reported that pastors feel confident that parishioners are ready for the new translations, and while there may be some initial confusion and questions, the majority of the faithful are anxious for the implementation.

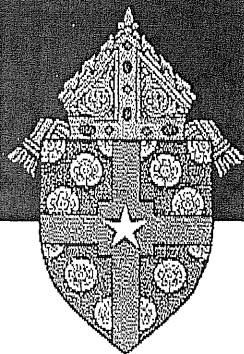

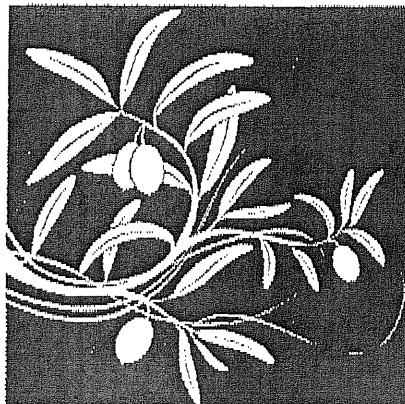
