REMINDER - ELECTION SEASON

In the document Faithful Citizenship, the US Bishops Conference has outlined the important principles to be considered in voting. They include Protecting Human Life, Promoting Family Life, Pursuing Social Justice and Practicing Global Solidarity. Teaching, from the pulpit or otherwise, which omits comprehensive reference to all these principles does a disservice to the Bishops' efforts to fully inform the consciences of the Faithful and may be viewed as selective and partisan. Homilists are encouraged to be mindful that the goal of the Church to encourage Catholics to vote, while not endorsing specific candidates or political parties, cannot be achieved by fragmenting the message of Faithful Citizenship.

Also, please remember that distribution of political literature (propaganda, endorsements of political party or candidate, etc.) on parish property is prohibited. These publications are not proper for distribution on parish property as they engage in partisan politics. Please do not allow political literature to be distributed by parishioners or anyone else in the Church or on parish property unless it is voter education material prepared by the USCCB or has the specific approval of the Archbishop's office.

ALL SOULS DAY AND MASS STIPENDS

A practice seems to have developed in some parishes that for All Souls Day parishioners are encouraged to write down the names of deceased loved ones and with a donation, place the envelope in the collection. The All Souls Day Masses are celebrated for all the named persons and the priests distribute the entire collected amount amonast themselves. This practice is scandalous and violates the law of the Church regarding Mass stipends. In 1992 the Congregation for the Clergy issued a directive on Collective Mass Intentions. In this document it is stated that the Church allows on rare occasions the combining of Mass intentions as long as the faithful are explicitly informed that the Mass intentions will be combined. In these cases, however, the priest may only take the dollar amount equal to one stipend (\$5.00 in the dioceses of Texas). The rest of the stipend offering is to be forwarded to other priests to fulfill the Mass intentions or to the chancery for forwarding to missionary priests. The text of the Congregation's directive can be found in the Eucharist section of the diocesan Pastoral Manual.

HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

On back to back occurrence of Sunday and Holy Days, there is a precept of Eucharist participation for each day. However, whenever January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated (NCCB, 11/17/92, Congregation for Bishops, While the Holy day obligation is 7/4/92). automatically abrogated on these days, the liturgy of the feast is still to be celebrated in every parish and institution at a convenient time in such a way that the dignity of the feast is maintained.



Minutes
Meeting of August 14, 2012

The Council met in the third floor conference room of the Nold Building at St. Mary Seminary. Fr. Rivers Patout called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Msgr. Chester Borski offered the Opening Prayer. Fr. Paul Felix took the roll.

MINUTES: The minutes of June 5, 2012 were accepted as presented. They were accepted by a voice vote.

ARCHDIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN SUMMARY: Mr. Jim Barrette, Secretary for Pastoral and Educational Ministries, and Ms. Mary Grace Landram appeared before the Council so as to provide an update on the progress of the Pastoral Planning process. They provided handout materials including a list of implementation milestones. They reported the following:

- task groups have been identified to complete the work in numerous areas.
- A project timeline has been established from May of 2012 through May of 2013.
- Task group leaders and members are being recruited.
- Close parishes for regional meetings are being recruited.
- Intercessions for the Pastoral Plan were sent to parishes through the Chancery Advisory
- Bulletin announcements have been sent to the parishes through the Chancery Advisory.
- The Cardinal was preparing a video for parishes that will summarize the work of the Planning Sequence and share the Pathways to the future.

Mr. Barrette indicated that the flow of this process begins with the current parish view leading to regional meetings of parishes, which will enable the development of parish action plans and of Chancery staff action plans.

Mr. Barrette clarified that the APC representatives are not a conduit for information from the APC to the parish. This would only happen in those cases wherein Cardinal DiNardo would ask them to do so. The Cardinal will communicate information through the Pastors.

Parishes will discern which archdiocesan objectives they will choose to adopt based on what's going on in the parish.

The question of deanery alignment is relevant for this process as is the question of opening new parishes in areas of significant growth.

The regional meetings will take place in the timeframe of November through December. After responding to questions and discussion Mr. Barrette and Ms. Landrum were thanked for their presentation.

<u>PROBLEMS WITH SPORTS ACTIVITIES ON SUNDAY:</u> Msgr. Leo Wleczyk presented and led a discussion of concern over problems with sports activities in conflict with mass attendance on Sundays and participation in religious education and sacrament preparation programs. He pointed out that many people see nothing wrong with going to sports programs as a higher priority than religious practice and education. When children are in tournaments the parents and grandparents are removed from religious practice. He stated that Protestant pastors are concerned about the same issue.

The subsequent discussion included the topic of summer intensive CCE program modules and home school programs for sacrament preparation. Other comments included an observation that tournaments frequently take place during Holy Week and the Triduum. Another observation was that Good Friday is the busiest day of the year for golf courses.

<u>FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS</u>: Fr. Rivers Patout requested agenda items to be submitted to him in writing indicating the topic, the presenter's name and the proposed length of the presentation.

<u>ANNOUNCEMENTS & CONSULTATIONS</u>: Cardinal DiNardo spoke on the following:

• He informed the Council that he attended the National Black Catholic Conference, which takes place every five years. He shared that the African-American community feels neglected. We have 11 or 12 parishes in the archdiocese with significant African American presence. He spoke about the question of vocations and how to enable men in formation to feel culturally comfortable.

- He asks, during the Fall, that we keep working to raise consciousness regarding the issue of religious freedom and the Department of Health and Human Services rules.
- The Cardinal informed the Council that he had attended the Knights of Columbus convention. He encouraged our presence and support as important for the Knights of Columbus.
- The Cardinal encourage supporting the inner-city schools through the Cardinal Circle as well as other available means.
- He said that the National Association of Pastoral Musicians' work in implementing the new translation of the Missal is going well. He pointed out that there is no musical setting for Mass that is being utilized across the board. He asked the question would one common musical setting be helpful for our archdiocese? He encouraged us to talk to her pastoral musicians.
- Cardinal reminded us of the upcoming Year of Faith opening in October. Cardinal wants to open the Year of Faith using the September Mass in celebration of the 50th and 25th anniversaries of marriage at the Brown convention Center. We already have 500 couples signed up. This is emphasizing the Vatican II call to holiness in everyday life as lived through marriage and the family.
- The CCE and youth offices are unpacking the framework of evangelization and formation from baptism to death. The framework will translate into curriculum. The names of these respective offices were changed to help in that effect more completely what we want them to do. The Holy Father wants us emphasizing catechesis leading to evangelization and evangelization leading to catechesis in order to make Jesus known.
- He indicated he would be going on vacation next week.

<u>CLOSING PRAYER AND GRACE</u>: Cardinal DiNardo led the Council in the concluding prayer and grace before the meal.

Dear Brother Priests,
